Festival kicked off this afternoon in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan

Ânskohk (ANS-cook) translates to English as "passing on the teaching; tying one generation to the next or passing the story on." Under the banner of this year's theme, From Woodsmoke to Bandwidth, audiences can expect to learn how Indigenous storytelling has changed and evolved alongside time and technology. Featured 2021 authors and presenters include Jesse Wente, Waubgeshig Rice, Maria Campbell, Rosanna Deerchild and many more.

"While thousands have attended in-person Festivals over the years, over five hundred at the biannual event in 2019 alone, this year we are going with a blend of in-person and virtual speakers and presentations," explained Bird-Wilson. "All in-person events require proof of vaccination or a negative COVID-19 test result, but we recommend you check our website, sawci.ca, in advance for specific entrance requirements of the venue you are planning on attending."
